SEPPELT MOUNT IDA HEATHCOTE SHIRAZ 2017

The Region: Heathcote, VIC

The Aromatics: Dark plums and chocolate deliver a powerful yet graceful bouquet, enlightened by earthy spices and savoury elements.

The Flavours: Bright blackberries combine with savoury, earthy characters and fine powdery tannins for a superb showcase of premium cool climate Shiraz. Cedary oak adds complexity.

The Longevity: Enjoy now or develop in the cellar up to 2030

ROSEMOUNT ESTATES BALMORAL SYRAH 2017

The Region: McLaren Vale, SA

The Aromatics: Rich layers of blood plum, mulberry and bitter chocolate notes with undertones of cassis and dried spices combine with subtle oak for enriching aromatics.

The Flavours: An explosion of vibrant dark fruits splash across the palate slowly subsiding to reveal dark chocolate, black pepper and a savoury hint. Soft velvety tannins carry the wine to a long finish.

The Longevity: Enjoy now or let develop in the cellar up to 2030

LINDEMAN'S COONAWARRA TRIO 'ST GEORGE' CABERNET SAUVIGNON 2016

The Accolades: Gold Medal 2018 Limestone Coast Wine Show

The Region: Coonawarra, SA

The Aromatics: Perfumed brambly blackberry fruits with tobacco, violets and black olives combine for a moody but marvellously seductive bouquet.

ST HUBERTS YARRA VALLEY PINOT NOIR 2016

The Region: Yarra Valley, SA

The Aromatics: Complex earthy aromatics drape over a core of cherries, enhanced by hints of red fruits and olives. This enriching bouquet is nicely framed by spicy French oak.

The Flavours: This light-to-medium bodied wine is supple and textured with red berries following on from the nose. Fine-grained, structural tannins precede the long cherry finish.

The Longevity: Perfect to enjoy now or develop in the cellar up to 2022

DEVIL'S LAIR MARGARET RIVER CABERNET SAUVIGNON 2016

The Region: Margaret River, WA
The Aromatics: Fragrant, lifted

aromas of dark plum and blackcurrant fruit, with layers of ripe dark fruits. Hints of mint and liquorice follow, along with well-integrated, light, spicy oak.

METALA WHITE LABEL LANGHORNE CREEK SHIRAZ CABERNET 2017

The Region: Langhorne Creek, SA The Aromatics: Bright plums, blueberries and redcurrants sing the song of Langhorne Creek in this beautifully aromatic red blend.

The Flavours: A medium-bodied wine with fine velvety tannins length and depth of flavour. Subtle oak brings depth of flavour to the dark berry fruits of mulberry, plums and hints of mint.

The Longevity: Enjoy now or develop in the cellar up to 2024

YOU SAY SHIRAZ, I SAY SYRAH

If you venture to southern France's Rhône Valley (or wander to the imported part of the bottle shop) you're entering the original home of Syrah. This is the region most synonymous with the perfumed, full-bodied traditional style of wine with dark fruits and spices. If France is too far, we recommend a visit over the ditch as our Kiwi friends are rather fond of a Syrah style too.

Syrah is in fact, the same genetic grape as the better-known variety in Australia – Shiraz. Our industry was founded on the grape, which arrived in 1832 with 'the father of Australian wine' James Busby. From the big bold Barossa style to cool

climate Victorian stunners, Shiraz is the undisputed darling of Australian wine – and we're home to the world's oldest continuously productive Shiraz vines with vineyards believed to date back to 1843.

The typical old-world Syrah is lighter and leaner than the newworld Shiraz, which is more intense, richer and full-bodied. And with winemakers of today showcasing their mastery (our world-famous legacy is all thanks to Max Schubert's love of the variety resulting in the iconic Grange), you'll discover Aussie Syrah's on the table too – so remember in many places, the labelling is an indication of style (it's the same with Pinot Grigio and Gris too). The important thing to remember is that one style is not better than the other – just a different tasting experience. Both are truly fabulous food wines, especially with charcuterie, grilled and roasted meats and aged cheeses.

If you're looking to support our homegrown winemakers you're spoiled for choice when it comes to Shiraz and Syrah. The late-budding and late-ripening red grape is grown in virtually every region in Australia, which allows the influence of climate and terroir to influence the diversity of wines. So, no matter whether you say Shiraz and I say Syrah, go forth and explore the awesome diversity of Australia's foremost red wine grape – it promises to be the most deliciously palatable journey.
