19 Crimes turned criminals into colonists. Upon conviction, British rogues, guilty of at least one of the 19 Crimes, were sentenced to live in Australia, rather than death.

This punishment by 'transportation' began in 1788, and many of the lawless died at sea. For the rough-hewn prisoners who made it to shore, a new world awaited. As pioneers in a frontier penal colony, they forged a new country and new lives, brick by brick.

This wine is borne of the rules they broke and the culture they built. And like our legendary rogues, it's a taste that'll live forever in infamy.

## **TASTING NOTE**

IN RUM BARRELS

Colour: medium red with bright ruby hues.

Nose: intense lifted mocha, sweet spice, and raspberry fruit.

**Palate**: full and round, with a mocha and spice sweetness giving a rich and round mouth feel. Subtle flavours of brown sugar and cinnamon, with a plush finish filled with jammy blackberry and raspberry.

## WINE DETAILS

Vineyard Region: South Eastern Australia. Grape Variety: Shiraz-dominant blend. Maturation: 20% Rum Barrels for 30 days, and a combination of French and American oak.
