

SHIRAZ



This punishment by 'transportation' began in 1788, and many of the lawless died at sea. For the rough-hewn prisoners who made it to shore, a new world awaited. As pioneers in a frontier penal colony, they forged a new country and new lives, brick by brick.

This wine is borne of the rules they broke and the culture they built. And like our legendary rogues, it's a taste that'll live forever in infamy.

TASTING NOTE

Colour: bright red to crimson hues.

Nose: intense lifted vanilla aromatics balanced with ripe raspberry and plum fruits.

Palate: full and round, with a subtle sweetness giving a rich and round mouth feel. The vanilla aromatics carry through and compliment flavours of raspberries, dark plums, and chocolate. Plush tannins provide a lingering finish.

WINE DETAILS

Vineyard Region: South Eastern Australia.

Grape Variety: Shiraz.

Maturation: 100% American oak.
